## **Documentaries:**

<u>Adopted: For the Life of Me</u> Follows Dave, a fifty-two year old adoptee as he embarks on a journey to find his birthmother. His saga, with its unexpected and moving epiphany, illuminates the impact secrets can have over an entire lifetime. <u>http://www.adoptedforthelifeofme.com/</u>

<u>Closure</u>: A documentary about a transracial adoptee who finds her birth mother, and meets the rest of a family who didn't know she existed, including her birth father. <u>Broken Places</u> Explores why some children are severely damaged by early adversity while others are able to thrive. By revisiting some of the abused and neglected children we profiled decades ago, we're able to dramatically illustrate how early trauma shaped their lives as adults. BROKEN PLACES interweaves these longitudinal narratives with commentary from a few nationally renowned experts to help viewers better understand the devastating impact of childhood adversity as well as the inspiring characteristics of resilience. <u>Blind Eyes Opened</u> A Christian documentary that dives deep into the sex trafficking industry in the U.S. The film exposes the darkness that fuels demand, highlights survivors' transformations through Christ, engages lawmakers, law enforcement, organizations, ministries and experts across the country committed to ending the atrocities, all while showing Christ as the hope for all involved.

<u>Congratulations, You're On Your Own</u>: Life After Foster Care <u>Congratulations, You're On Your Own</u>: <u>Life After Foster Care</u> is a Hilton Foundation-funded documentary that is part of its Foster Youth Strategic Initiative aimed at supporting youth leaving the child welfare system. These real-life stories of young adults—"transition-age youth," as the film terms them—who have recently left the foster care system are told by the youths themselves as well as by professionals in the foster-care world.

<u>Cracked Up (here)</u> In *Cracked Up* we witness the impact adverse childhood experiences can have across a lifetime through the incredible story of actor, comedian, master impressionist and *Saturday Night Live* veteran, Darrell Hammond. Behind the scenes Darrell suffered from debilitating flashbacks, self injury, addiction and misdiagnosis, until the right doctor isolated the key to unlocking the memories his brain kept locked away for over 50 years. *Cracked Up* creates an inspiring balance between comedy and tragedy helping us understand the effects of childhood trauma in a new light, breaking down barriers of stigma and replacing shame with compassion and hope.

<u>The Dark Matter of Love</u> is a documentary following the Diaz family as they adopt three children from a Russian orphanage. Expecting a joyous experience, the Diaz parents struggle with both cultural barriers and their adoptees' troubled past in their efforts to bond. To help, they enlist the aid of world-famous developmental psychologist Dr. Robert Marvin. (here)

<u>First Circle</u> A revealing documentary about Foster Care, family, and healing in the Western United States. <u>Foster</u> Foster is an HBO documentary chronicling true stories about children in the foster care system. With never-before access to the Los Angeles County Department of Children and Family Services (the largest county child welfare agency in the country), the filmmakers head into courtrooms, foster homes, juvenile centers, hospitals, and the neighborhoods of Los Angeles to capture what goes on in foster care in the United States, and even upend some myths.

<u>Trust: Second Acts in Young Lives</u> TRUST is about creativity and the unexpected resources inside people you might discount because they are poor, young or of color. APTP is a neighborhood theater project dedicated to helping young people reimagine their experiences on stage. Marlin's is one of incredible struggle and pain, from enduring rape as young girl, to the difficult journey of immigrating to the U.S., to further abuse at the hands of her own brother, and finally to emancipation and overcoming substance addiction. <u>http://trustdocumentary.org/</u>

<u>Paper Tigers</u> (Here) This award winning film documents a year in the life of an alternative high school that has radically changed its approach to disciplining its students, becoming a promising model for how to break the cycles of poverty, violence, and disease that affects families. Due to the honest approach to the subject matter, recommended for mature youth and adults interested in learning more about trauma-informed strategies.

<u>Prescription for Hope: Overcoming Nevada's Opioid Epidemic</u> The 29-minute documentary received a regional Emmy nomination for best documentary. It follows the lives of several Nevadans who have experienced the loss of a loved one due to opioids and the constant battle and power of hope to overcome an opioid addiction. <u>https://vimeo.com/286378323</u>

<u>The Hungry Heart</u> Explores the struggles and challenges faced by Dr. Holmes and the simple and profound connection he forges with each of his patients. The Hungry Heart shines a light on the healing power of conversation and the need for connection that many of these young addicts yearn for in their lives. Interviews with older addicts discussing their recovery process are juxtaposed against Fred's younger patients. The road to recovery is paved with success stories and strewn with relapses, and downfalls. The Hungry Heart profiles the many faces and diverse populations of those struggling with addiction, and their continued search for a life of recovery. http://thehungryheartmovie.org/about-the-film/

Tough Love (Here) PBS documentary <u>Tough Love</u>, from Emmy-nominated filmmaker Stephanie Wang-Breal, chronicles the story of two parents, one in Seattle and one in New York City, both of whom have lost custody of their children to child protective services. The film follows their efforts to redeem themselves in two different child welfare systems and prove they are worthy of being parents. Getting a second chance turns out to be a tortuous process as they encounter a complex and entrenched bureaucracy.

Unadopted is a documentary centered around Noel, a youth who entered the California foster care system at the age of one. Separated from his siblings most of his life and lacking a complete understanding of what happened to his family, Noel begins the journey of uncovering his own case files and history after emancipating himself. The heart of the documentary highlights the need for teen foster homes and families willing to adopt them. We follow the stories of two other foster teens as they navigate court hearings, relationships with birth parents, and aging out of foster care. They bravely open up about their questions, fears, and struggles, which by far outweigh those of their peers. (Here)
